MENU DEL DIA...

Menu Del Dia... In 1964, under General Francisco Franco, the Spanish government mandated that all restaurants offer a menu Turístico, requiring explicit advertising and the inclusion of “appetisers and beverages” at prices set by the government. But while this mandate gave the menu the form it still holds today, it was not always so popular.

Under the initial policy, restaurant owners were prohibited from offering any other menu besides Turístico. In 1970, with a priority on regional specials, prices were raised marginally and again in 1976. In 1981 the mandatory prices were removed, and restaurant owners were allowed the economic flexibility to be more creative with their deals. Since then, the menu Del dia has risen in price, quality and popularity. In 2010, the federal requirement for a menu Del dia offering was finally removed. Today, Madrid is the only community where the original 1965 decree remains, but the menu Del dia is still alive and well in every corner of Spain.
